Transportation from the Airport and some helpful advice for getting around in Belgrade

A taxi from the Nikola Tesla Airport to the hotel should cost around 2000 Dinars (RSD) (1 EUR is around 118 Dinars). If you show the driver the address of the Palace Hotel, you can either agree upon the price or they will use the taximeter, but that is a roughly estimated price. In some taxis it is possible to pay with credit card, but you should ask beforehand.

Here is some information about the public transportation system in Belgrade: You can buy a prepaid card to be used for the public transportation system. You can charge money on the prepaid cards at the same place where you can buy that card. Those cards can be bought at all corner shops/kiosks and cost 250 RSD. When you enter the bus/train/cable car, you have to validate your card. Your ride is then valid for 90 minutes. If you change the bus within those 90 minutes, you have to repeat the process, but you will not be charged money again, as long as you do it within the 90 minutes. One ride costs 89 RSD. Alternatively to using the prepaid card, you can buy a ticket in a bus/train/cable car valid for one ride that costs 150 RSD.

You can drink tap water. All major credit cards can be used (VISA, VISA Electron, MasterCard etc). In most shops, restaurants etc. credit cards are accepted. However, they are not accepted in most museums and other public institutions.

Rates for exchanging the money are better in exchange offices than in banks. You should check online if your home bank is also available in Belgrade, because in that case you should be able to withdraw money without additional provision. There are a plenty of ATMs around both the Faculty of Philology and around the Hotel Palace.


Tipping is not necessary, but if you do tip, around 10% should be just fine.
