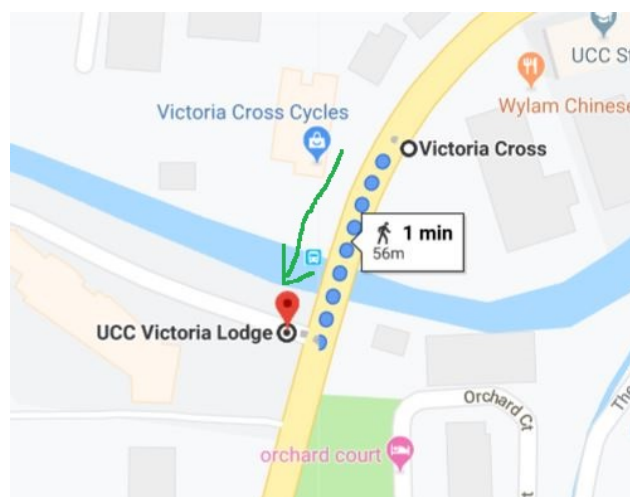

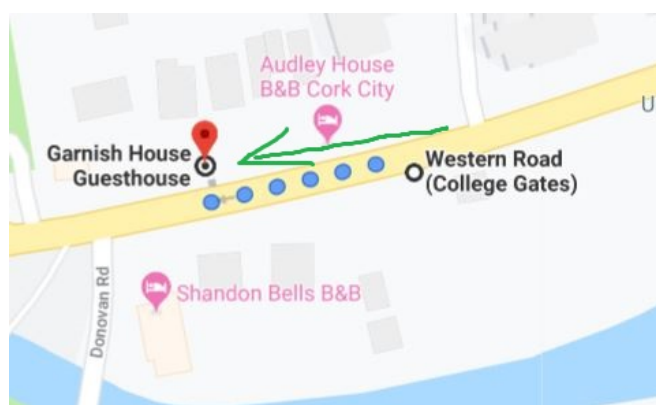

Transportation to the accommodation from the airport and train station

You can use the public bus to reach your accommodations from the airport. Take bus no. 226 or 226a towards Kent Station. Change at **Cork Bus Station** to bus no. 208 towards Curraheen. For the doctoral students' accommodation (**Victoria Lodge**), get out at **Victoria Cross** bus stop. It's about a one minute walk from the bus stop to Victoria Lodge.



To get to the senior advisors' accommodation (**Garnish House**), use also bus no. 226 or 226a towards Kent Station and get out at **Cork Bus Station**. Change here to bus no. 205 (towards Bishopstown, CIT Campus) or 208 (towards Curraheen) and get out at bus stop **Western Road (College Gates)**. It's about a one minute walk from the bus stop to Garnish House.



If you arrive by train at Kent Station, take bus no. 208 towards Curraheen and get out at **Victoria Cross** bus stop to reach Victoria Lodge. To reach Garnish House, use the same bus and get out at **Western Road (College Gates)**.
