18th EAJS Workshop for Doctoral Students



Introduction

The **18th European Association for Japanese Studies (EAJS) Workshop for Doctoral Students** is organized at the Department of Asian Studies at Palacký University Olomouc in Olomouc, Czech Republic on 23–26 August 2022.

The workshop will take place at the following address: tř. Svobody 26, 779 00 Olomouc.

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Program

The workshop program will begin with a **welcome dinner at 19:00** (CET) **on Tuesday, 23 August**. The dinner will take place at a restaurant called Potrefená Husa at Michalská 2, 779 00 Olomouc. You will be guided there by our doctoral student assistants.

- For advisors: Please be at the reception of your hotel at 18:40.
- For student participants: Please be at the reception of your hotel at 18:30.

The actual workshop sessions will take place on Wednesday and Thursday, 24-25 August.

On Wednesday 24 August, our doctoral student assistants will **help participants get to the workshop venue** by picking them up at their hotels.

- For advisors: Please be at the reception of your hotel at 08:35.
- For student participants: Please be at the reception of your hotel **at 08:20**.

All participants will be asked to **present their project** in front of the whole group, that is, other doctoral students and senior advisors. The presentations will be structured as a small conference. The order of presentations is specified below (see Sessions).

- The participants are expected to prepare a 10-minute-long presentation (ideally using PowerPoint, Prezi or another form of a visual aid).
 - The rooms are equipped with PCs (with Windows OS, MS Office, a PDF reader, Internet browser, etc.), data projectors, pointers, and speakers. Please bring your presentation on a USB flash drive, upload it onto the computer before your session starts, and check whether all is in order. You might want to save your presentation as a PDF file as well so as to make sure that you have a backup.
 - WiFi access is available via Eduroam network.
- Following each presentation, there will be up to 15 minutes for questions, comments, and discussion.
- To make the interaction as fruitfut as possible, students are expected to read other participants' project reports before coming to the workshop.

In addition, there will also be sessions in 5 **smaller groups** into which the participants are divided based on their field of research. The **discussions** within these groups will be led by senior advisors who specialize in the respective field (see Senior advisors | Thematic groups).

The participants will therefore be able to discuss their research project with people that work across different disciplines as well as receive more detailed feedback from a senior advisor and fellow students within their group.

Those interested in group **sightseeing** can join doctoral students from the Department of Asian Studies at Palacký University Olomouc for sightseeing walks that will take place **on Wednesday and Thursday from 17:00**. The group will be leaving from the workshop venue (tř. Svobody 26) and will visit the main sights that Olomouc has to offer on foot. The tour each day ends by walking together to the restaurant where dinner will be served. See Map A and Map B for routes of the two walks.

Transport

Please take care of arranging your round trip to Olomouc yourself. EAJS will reimburse travel costs up to 400 EUR, given that participants choose the least expensive reasonable mode of transportation, such as discount fare economy flight or standard class train or bus, etc. Please make sure to retain your travel documents in the original. After the workshop, the EAJS Office will send you a reimbursement form, which you need to fill out and send back together with the travel documents so that you can be reimbursed.

Travelling to/from Olomouc

The majority of international visitors coming to Olomouc arrives at and departs from the international airport in Prague (Václav Havel Airport, 280 km). The fastest way to get from Prague to Olomouc is by train.

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Travelling within Olomouc

The workshop venue, your hotel, and the restaurants where we will take our lunches and dinners are all located within walking distance from each other.

Alternatively, you can also use trams and busses to travel within Olomouc.

- The stop closest to the workshop venue is **Tržnice**.
- The stop in front of the main railway station is called **Hlavní nádraží**.
- The stop closest to Hotel Palác, where all doctoral student participants are accommodated, is called **U Dómu**.
- The stop closest to Theresian Hotel, where all senior advisors are accommodated, is called **Okresní soud**.

There are currently construction works going on on the tracks of the main connections. Therefore, there are some

changes to the standard routes and connection numbers. The map of currect connections is available here .

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Accommodation

The accommodation is taken care of for the duration of the workshop, i.e., for 23-26 August 2022.

The **doctoral student participants** are staying at **Hotel Palác** at 1. Máje 869/27, 779 00 Olomouc (map). The hotel is situated 1,2 km from the Olomouc main train station (Olomouc hlavní nádraží) and can be easily accessed by walking along a single street (10–15 min.). Alternatively, participants can make use of public transport (see Transport for details). The tram stop closest to the hotel is called **U Dómu**. Trams no. 2 and 4 stop there. The ride from the main train station takes about 5 minutes (see this map for names of stations that come prior to U Dómu). To reach the hotel, participants need to walk some 150 meters back in the direction the tram came from.

- the reception is open from 7AM till 10PM
- standard check-in is after 2PM (and no later than 10PM)
- standard check-out is before 10AM (and no earlier than 7AM)
- you can store your luggage at the hotel for several hours after you check out
- breakfast is included

The **senior advisors** are staying at **Theresian Hotel** at Javoříčská 5, 779 00 Olomouc (map). The hotel is located round the corner from a tram/bus stop called **Okresní soud**. Due to construction works, there are now two fast and easy public transport options that the advisors can make use of to get to the hotel from the Olomouc main train station (Olomouc hlavní nádraží). The advisors can either take bus no. X or tram no. 4. The ride on bus no. X takes 7 minutes; the ride on tram no. 4 takes 10 minutes (see this map for current bus/tram routes). Please see Transport below for more details.

- the reception is open 24/7
- standard check-in is after 2PM
- standard check-out is before 10AM
- breakfast is included
- entrance to on-site fitness is included
- entrance to on-site wellness centre is available at a reduced price

Both senior advisors and student participants **will be picked up from their hotel** before the welcome dinner on Tuesday and before the first sessions on Wednesday. Should you have any questions regarding the transportation, do not hesitate to contact us.

Meals

Meals for the duration of the workshop are covered. We will arrange and cover the welcome dinner on Tuesday evening, breakfast, lunch, dinner and refreshments on Wednesday and Thursday, and breakfast on Friday, after which the workshop will officially end.

The workshop program will begin with a **welcome dinner** on the evening of Tuesday, 23 August at 19:00 (CET). The dinner will take place at a restaurant called Potrefená Husa at Michalská 2, 779 00 Olomouc (map). You will be guided there by our doctoral student assistants. Therefore, we ask doctoral student participants to be at the reception of their hotel at 18:30 and advisors to be at the reception of their hotel at 18:40 to meet them.

Please take breakfast on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday at your hotel.

Refreshments will be provided during coffee breaks on Wednesday and Thursday.

Participants should inform the EAJS Office in case of dietary restrictions or preferences (e.g., vegetarian).

Further practical info

Covid-19

As of June 2022, **there are no longer any coronavirus restrictions** for entry into and stay in the Czech Republic. Please check the requirements issued by your own countries as well as transit countries. Should the situation in the Czech Republic change, we will let you know.

In order to ensure that everyone stays healthy and feels safe, we would like to ask all participants to **bring** their **own masks** and wear them when indoors especially if not feeling well or not feeling safe because of week immune system, etc. Before the start of the first workshop session, the participants **will** further **be provided with antigen tests**. Those who will not agree with the testing and those who will get a positive result will be asked to return to their hotel room and participate in the workshop via Zoom.

Telecomunication

WiFi access at the workshop venue is available via Eduroam network as well as via a guest account (log-in information will be provided). WiFi is also available at your accommodation and at most restaurants, coffee shops, long-distance trains, etc.

Mobile phone operators in the Czech Republic use standard **European GSM bands** (1800 MHz, 900 MHz). If you come from outside Europe, you may need a tri-band phone. No roaming fees among EU member states. The country calling code for the Czech Republic is +420.

Electricity

In the Czech Republic, standard European sockets **CEE 7/5 (230 V/50Hz)** are used. Please bring an adapter with you if you wish to use appliances/plugs that do not work with these socket types/voltages.

Money

The **Czech crown (koruna, CZK, Kč)** is the official currency in the Czech Republic. The approximate exchange rate is **25 CZK / 1 EUR** (as of June 2022). Credit cards and debit cards are widely accepted, so there is little need to exchange your money or withdraw cash.

Weather

August is usually **the hottest month** of the year for the Czech Republic. However, the temperatures **may vary widely**, with one week boasting tropical weather while another week being rainy and somewhat cold. Please check the weather forecast before packing.
